Before telling you why we think you can be rich and generous with almost any salary (the topic of this post) we want to tell you a little about ourselves. These are we: my wife Krista and IÅ, met six years ago at the George Fox University in Newberg or while served as a leader of the Ministry of Students. Our passion for Jesus and people was well matched and we decided to serve side by side to help others was something we could do for life. We got married three years later in Portland, in the operating room. Work as a full-time shepherd of the youth at 2nd Street Community Church. My wife Krista is a part-time administrative assistant at the annual meeting of the Friends of the Northwest, a member of the Love Inc Newberg Board of Directors and Voluntary Mentor in the Weekly Love Inc. relational Pastoral Program. I am a shepherd, it is unreasonable for me to expect to make an international holiday every year, drive a new BMW or Mercedes or buy my food from Zupans. It is reasonable for me to make an occasional holiday on the coast, drive a used Honda and go shopping from Trader Joes. God does not "provide" that I am irresponsible. God has also given us the logic. What is life for me? So now let's move on to the core of the matter. As you can imagine, work as a youth shepherd is not the most lucrative profession. Don't misunderstand me, the church for which I work is incredibly generous with me. I have a pension pension program that rivals with me. of my friends working in business or engineering. However, I certainly do not stop you a huge salary. I have a master, works full time and is paid about \$28,000 a year after taxes. In total my wife and I make about \$44,000 in net annual pay. Here are some of which we were able to do with that money in the two and a half years in which we were married: pay money for the GRAD school to tune \$24,000. My wife just finished her masters in Dic, 2013. It pays over \$20,000 in student loan debt, all accrued by our university education. We only have \$3,700 left to go. Pay in cash for our new (to us) Honda Civic Å€ "A sweet race that brings us about \$7,900. We're huge Honda fans. Save 15% of our pension income. Once our loans are paid, it will arrive up to 25%. Give away 12% of our income every year to organizations, individuals and causes we support. While we are proud of those first four things, it is the fifth in which we find a real joy. It's great to be generous to others, we do it because of how beautiful it is to use your wealth to be a blessing to other people. Leaving our expectations and focusing on Gamechechanger (radical choices that increase your income or decrease your spending) my wife and I are on track to withdraw in our half of live live very comfortably and simply live our wildest financial dream, giving away half of our money.
